Calvary Lutheran marks 20th birthday

Calvary Evangelical Lutheran Church of Southfield will celebrate its 2th anniversary Aug. 12 and 13. A weekend replete with special activities has been planned by various committees of the congregation. Chairing the upcoming celebration are Jane and Phil Dakin of Bingham Farms.

The church began in May of 1957, when the Reverend Howard H. Schaar was called by the Board of American Missions of the United Lutheran in America to organize a congregation in Southfield.

The first worship service was held on Sept. 15, 1987 in the gymnasium of Lathrup School with 80 people in attendance. The first session of the Sunday Church School was on Sept. 29 at the school with 23 children attending.

Gurary Evangelical Lutheran Church was formally chartered as a motion of the Lutheran Church on Man. 30, 1936. Sixty-one adults signed the charter roll, representing 97 between the control of the control of the charter roll, representing 97 between members.

BY JULY 23, 1961, congregants were worshipping in their new church. That same year Reverned Harry S. Peters, Jr., became pastor and remained with the church nutil 1969. He was one of the founders and past presidents of the Southfield Curgy Association. Calvary became a self-supporting congregation by 1965 and the church as it stands presently, was completed on Sept. 15, 1965.

Two more pastors have served at Calvary, the Reverend H. Cole Reasin from 1970 to 1975 and the Reverend Samuel Hays, the resent pastor.

Calvary is not an island unto itself but one of over 6,000 congregations of the Lutheran Church in America, rep-resenting over 3 million people.


