"I try to create a feeling in the staff that they can come up with decisions independently," he said.

MANAGEMENT IS NOT the only area where the MCCC president differs from OCC's recent leadership. Roelofs said he would involve OCC instatewide community college affairs and would run an open administration.

"The president has to try to be a statesman. He has to be able to say This looks best for the community college system as a whole." I can say that this has worked best for Macomb." he said.

This differs radically from Hill's views. Under Hill, OCC shunned membership in the Michigan Community College Association and avoided involvement in regional community college activities.

"No one knows what Oakland Com-munity College needs better than Oak-

land Community College," Hill once said in an interview. In contrast, Roelofs said, "1d try to speak for what's good for education and the community college system. 1'd say don't look just at the hottom line for a single community college. If it's beneficial for the community college, stem, it'll probably be beneficial for the school."

UNEXPECTEDLY, Roelofs' age became an issue. At 50, he would be the same age as Hill would have been. Trustee Barbara Jane Willing said she was afraid the board was wasting its time in the process if it would pick a person who intended to retire in two wars.

Roelofs revealed that when he applied for the presidency at MCCC he intended to retire at age 82. "That was contingent to having a financial position to be able to retire," he said.

"I've really changed my mind about retiring," he assured the trustees.
