Whispering Willows has managed to combine the best of both worlds—a great amount of play (506 rounds one day this summer) with the challenge of a tricky layout.

omery said there are 48 traps

on the course, six holes come into play and five water must be avoided.

Unlike some courses, which are doc test more challenging, nothing radical is planned for the O&E Tourneys, said Montgomery.

"The pin placements will be more challenging, but other than that, the course will play standard," he said.

The course seems unusually green considering the relative lack of rain. The fairways have been watered more this summer than in years past, said Montgomery.

"Number 11 (320 yards, par four) was on Jim Price's TV program last year," said Montgomery. "There are traps in back of the green, water in front and woods on both sides.

"There are good par threes—six (217 yards) and 14 (226 yards)—and seven (485 yards) is a good par five," continued Montgomery.

"It's a fairly long drive out of the woods om the seventh hole to the fairway and there are three traps around the green."
