Nosanichuk has worked on the Allied Jewish Campaign for 35 years and was on several United Jewish Appeal missions to Israel.

Following the Yom Kippur War, he saw the devastation by rocket fire in the Kiryat Shmona area of Israel and provided money for the May and Max Nosanichuk Forest. He has been active in many Israel Bond campaigns.

His communal activities include the Zionist Organization of America, Friends of Hebrew University, Jewish National Fund, Sharey Zedek Hospi-

tal and Bar-Ilan University. He is a member of Technion, ORT, Bnai Brith and Detroit Round Table of Christians and Jews.

Of his 14 trips to Israel, the most memorable was in 1972 when, with two granddaughters, he visited with David Ben-Gurion at the late statesman's home.

May Nosanichuk received her master's degree in education in 1967, specializing in language teaching. She serves as co-chairwoman of the Language Department for the Jewish Family Service and the Sinai Hospital Women's Guild and assists Russian immigrant.

She is a life member of the JNP and Sinai Hospital Women's Guild. She is also active in Hadassah Hospital, ORT and the Sisterhood of Congregation Beth Achim.

## Pewter and silver in museum exhibit

The special exhibit at the Plymouth Historical Museum will feature silver and pewter at a show beginning Aug. 31 and running through November 18.

In the early 1830s the people of Plymouth had to provide for their own necessities. Brooms were made by hand to "sweep the house clean" the "tin man" was always kept busy making lanterns and holders to protect people from the hot wax of the dripping candles.

Mothers and little girls carded, spun and wove the wool and flax into material for clothing, along with planting and tending to the garden so they

would have herbs to flavor their food. Older women brought their lacemaking talents from the old country and everyone helped leaves for "rushing" chairs.

Nothing was discarded—when clothing wore out the material was used for making quilts or cut into strips for rug hooking.

Dolls were made from corn husks for little girls to play with, and needlepoint, crewel and bachelero were taught in leisure hours.

These necessities will be exhibited on Sept. 9 from noon to 7 p.m. and Sept. 10 from noon to 6 p.m.
