**Consumer Mailbag**

How can I rid my yard of insects? I have a natural aversion to using pesticides. Are there any that are less harmful to use?

Insects are not necessarily a problem to gardeners. It is only when bugs or organisms are present in fairly large numbers that they become pests and require control.

A fly swatter is a pesticide, in a sense, since it kills pests. So is bowl or stale beer used to attract and drown slugs. And there are many other harmless "pesticides," in the literal sense.

Most chemical pesticides, however, contain toxic substances and should be used with great caution and only when there is an emergency situation and no other method for control is available. The following are a few of the pesticide controls recommended by Concern, Inc.:

- Dormant oil, a non-poisonous oil mixable with water, kills by coating and suffocating pest insect eggs. This can be safely used on fruit, elm and other deciduous trees.
- *Bacillus thuringiensis*, a bacterium, can be safely used to control cabbage worms without harming other plants or insects.
- Rotenone, Ryania and Pyrethrum, effective all-season sprays, available in powdered form, which are recommended for orchards.
- Barrier bands, non-drying sticky tapes which prevent caterpillars from crawling up tree trunks to feed on foliage.
- Nicotine sulfate, which can safely

be used to control leaf miner larvae which attack holly, birch, box, hollyhock and columbine.


