Midrasha College opens fall classes

The Midrasha College of Jewish Studies will begin the fall semester on Monday, Sept. 25. Thirty-eight courses will be offered in Hebrew language and literature, Yiddish, Biblical and post-Biblical literature and Jewish philosophy. Most classes will meet at the United Hebrew Schools, 21550 Twelve Mile in Southfield. Under a new arrangement, classes will also be offered for credit by Midrasha at the Young Israel Congregations of Oak Woods, Greenfield and Southfield Road. A daytime class in Yiddish will be taught by Morris Nobel at Borman Hall and is sponsored by a private donor. A joint program with Cong. Shaarey

Zedek for upper grade students has also been arranged. Three courses for six hours of credit will be offered. Courses include: "Origins of Rabbinic Judaism: Jewish Life in the Greco-Roman World," "Origins of the Jewish People: An Introduction to Biblical Archaeology" and "Intermediate and Advanced Hebrew Conversation." The Midrasha lunch and learning program will meet on Tuesdays and Thursdays this year. Courses are taught on Tuesday and Thursday mornings and Thursday afternoons. There is a \$1.50 charge for lunch.
