



# Tanguay Will Conduct Lay Meetings In Area

Livonian Philip Tanguay, the Detroit archdiocese new delegate to the laity, will be back in some territory for some of the get-acquainted meetings he plans with lay Catholics in nine vicariates during the next few weeks.

Tanguay has characterized the sessions -- for lay laymen and women with no clergyman invited -- as means for establishing closer communication between Cardinal John Dearden and members of the parishes in the archdiocese. Tanguay, who serves as the Cardinal's liaison with the laity, will be on hand for the meetings of the Farmington Southfield Vicariate in St. Fabian's social hall at 8 p.m., Tuesday, Oct. 21, and of the Northwest

Wayne Vicariate in St. Edith's Church hall, Livonia, at 8 p.m., Tuesday, Nov. 18. Seven other meetings are planned.

He said he was anxious first to get "personally acquainted" with the laymen expected to attend the meetings.

"They have to know me and know I am available to them as a delegate for the laity," he said. The representatives will have the responsibility of taking the knowledge they acquire to the parishes they represent. They also may subsequently arrange for extension of the person-to-person campaign between Tanguay and others in their parishes.
