Council Faces Busy Session

FARMINGTON
The Farmington City Council
will have a busy session at
its next meeting, Oct. 20.

After holding a public hear-ing and introducing the ordi-rance at its last meeting, the council will be ready to adopt a "deluxe!" multiple dwelling

The new R-5 zoning is designed to attract more exclu-sive and deluxe type apartment units. It has a lower density than the old multiple zoning

Setbacks between multiple med land and residential land

would be increased to 30 feet with a greenbelt required. The proposed ordinance also re-quires two parking spaces per unit.

Another ordinance up for adoption Oct, 20 is a new zoning ordinance for residential office districts. The proposed ordinance states that no offices shall be allowed in existing residential structures nor shall existing residents be converted to office use.

Another ordinance reduces the minimum height required for screening walls from six to four feet. The screening walls must be masonry brick or pour-ed cement.
