

Council Faces Busy Session

FARMINGTON The Farmington City Council will have a busy session at its next meeting, Oct. 20.

After holding a public hearing and introducing the ordinance at its last meeting, the council will be ready to adopt a "deluxe" multiple dwelling zoning.

The new R-5 zoning is designed to attract more exclusive and deluxe type apartment units. It has a lower density than the old multiple zoning with 10 units per acre maximum.

Setbacks between multiple zoned land and residential land would be increased to 30 feet with a greenbelt required. The proposed ordinance also requires two parking spaces per unit.

Another ordinance up for adoption Oct. 20 is a new zoning ordinance for residential-office districts. The proposed ordinance states that no offices shall be allowed in existing residential structures nor shall existing residents be converted to office use.

Another ordinance reduces the minimum height required for screening walls from six to four feet. The screening walls must be masonry brick or poured cement.

**Hall Comments On Petitions**

FARMINGTON Curtis Hall, Farmington Township supervisor says the actions regarding incorporation of the township south of 11 Mile except Quakertown and three square miles directly east of Quakertown, includes much of the township, Wood Creek Farms and Quakertown.

A GROUP of city residents filed petitions requesting an election to decide if the city could annex 12 square miles of the township. The territory, all of the township south of 11 Mile except Quakertown and three square miles directly east of Quakertown, includes much of the township, Wood Creek Farms and Quakertown.

Hall said there are "as many pluses as minuses" on both sides concerning the actions.

When asked if the filings might increase friction between township and city governments, Hall replied "not necessarily."

He said he has no personal knowledge of friction between the two governments' officials. The township has a history of good relations with the city, he insisted.

Hall said he had nothing to do with formulating the township incorporation papers which were filed. They are copies of those used in the 1936 incorporation attempt, he said.

THE PRESIDENT of the Farmington Board of Commerce said the moves toward incorporation and annexation will intensify activity leading up to the Nov. 4 election.

Tom Zoedus predicted both those for and against consolidation will be "just more enthusiastic" in their stands on the issue.

Zoedus also said he expects a larger vote on consolidation because of the filings.
