Meadow Brook has holiday tours

Meadow Brook Hall will be open for public tours 1-5 p.m. Dec. 24 and Dec. 31 from 1-5 p.m.

The historic 100-room mansion at Oakland University, Rochester, is the former home of Alfred and Matilda Dodge Wilson. (She was the widow of auto executive John Dodge.)

The Tudor-style home was built in the late 1930s at the cost of \$1.3 million and contains some of the world's outstanding examples of architectural

craftsmanship. Original furnishings and works of art are also preserved in the home.

General admission for tours is \$3.50, \$2 for senior citizens over 64 and children under 12.

Meadow Brook Hall is located on the east campus of Oakland University. Take I-76 to the university exit about 25 miles north of Detroit, drive to the campus and follow signs from there to the Hall's entrance on Adams Road. For more information, call 377-3140.

Course teaches food sanitation

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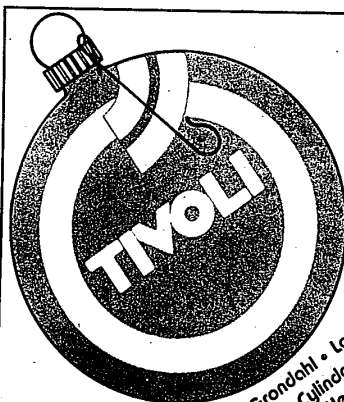
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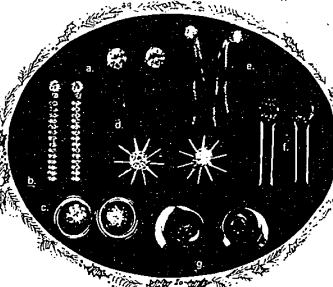
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
