# Our Christmas traditions have many origins

Most of the Christmas folk customs come to this country from England, Holland and Germany.

Colonists from these countries emphasized eating, drinking and general merry-making during the Christmas season, which began well in advance of Dec. 25 and extended to well behond the New Year.

The Yule log custom was brought from England, along with mince pies and plum pudding for the Christmas dinner. England also is responsible for

the wassail custom. The term origi-nally meant "warm ale" and later embraced a wide variety of special Christmas beverages that became part of the good cheer syndrome.

CAROLING was a folk practice that became popular in the colonies. Reli-gious and folk songs emphasized mirth, good fellowship and the happy quality of Christmas, and carolers visits were met by the custom of deco-rating houses with holly, ivy and mistletoe.

The Dutch colonists brought to New Amsterdam (New York) a number of Christmas customs that the were incorporated later into Marcine celebration. Chief among the merican celebration. Chief among they obtain the sit of St. Nicholas, who was popular with Catholics and Protestants allke in Holland.

Both the Dutch and the Germans stressed the importance of including children in celebrations stressing the idea of gift-giving, which is now a major portion of Christmas.

The Germans who settled in Penn-

sylvania brought the Christmas tree with them. This custom began its pupularity in the United State States in the middle of the 18th century. The importance of having a decorated tree spread from Philadelphia to Richmond to Cleveland and on across the land.

THE BELIEFS, symbols and customs described entered this country between 1820 and 1800. Each section of the country developed a Christmas celebration which mirrored its local culture, national background and national surroundings.


