

# RIF balloon is real high flier

It was a long time ago when Isaac Newton rubbed a sore spot on his head and theorized that what goes up, must come down.

The modest scope of old Isaac's experiments, however, pale in comparison to recent tests of his theory at three suburban elementary schools.

Newton's apple, after all, didn't come down in Connecticut. Jeff Sexton's balloon did.

In October, students at Douglas, Henry Ruff and Memorial elementary schools in Garden City released about 1,500 balloons with postcards attached as part of the Reading is FUNDamental (RIF) program.

Replies are still drifting in, and so far about 130 have been returned.

Most came back from Ontario. But at Douglas, where the balloons were released on a different day than at Henry Ruff and Memorial, eight cards have so far been returned from New York, two from Massachusetts, and Sexton's serendipitous sphere held out until Southington, Conn., before floating finally to earth.

More specifically, before floating into the backyard of the five-year-old nephew of that town's chamber of commerce director, Scott Brainerd, the five-year old, can't write. So his seven-year-old sister, Jennifer, replied and included a packet of information on Southington supplied by Elinor Silva, the Brainerds' business-minded

aunt. Also included was a clipping from a local newspaper about the incident.

"He's tickled to death about it. He wrote the girl a letter last week," said Sexton's father Ron.

Jeff himself didn't have much to say about the feat.

"I don't know. My mom wrote it, and I wrote it over," said Jeff, who says he's 9 1/2 years old.

"All in all, it was a super activity," said Donald Watkins, principal at Henry Ruff. The farthest traveling Ruff RIF balloon came down "just a little bit this side of Toronto," said Watkins.

The balloons from Douglas school were released Oct. 27, and some of them made it the east coast faster than you could drive there. One balloon turned up in Barnardston, Mass., one day after it was released here. Sexton's balloon landed in Southington that same, pre-Halloween weekend.

Nearly all of the returned cards came from children, which may say something about the willingness of adults to mess around with tired-out helium balloons.

Considering the Atlantic-coast location of Connecticut, there probably won't be any replies coming back from points farther west.

Unless, of course, a farmer's kid named O'Toole is out prowling the back 40 in County Cork right about now and he's just spotted a bright yellow balloon.
