way—the revamping of the center's library. "We're doing some replacing and cleaning and repairing to make it more comfortable, brighter and more useable. When that's done, we'll go from room to room for some early spring housecleaning. "Second most important room on the revamp list is the reception area, the front office, to give those people more space," she said.

A long range goal is the complete remodeling of the kitchen. "That will take some time and work and maybe even need a special fundraiser to accomplish," she said.

"But if it's done, we will be better able to accommodate groups who want to serve food from the kitchen, and we can move all of our cooking classes out there. Both would be a big plus for the center."

Another desire is to see the center have its own kiln. "It would help to expand the pottery classes," she said. "As things are now, the instructors have to take their students' work home to fire it for them."

MS. MASTERS comes to the center with an extensive public relations background,

stemming mostly from her work in health agencies. She is a graduate of Wayne State University, with a degree in mass communications and journalism.

She is proud of a radio broadcast she put together that won an award from WWJ that was highly effective as a public education effort on heart diseases and stroke and was re-broadcast by 180 U.S. stations.

She is the winner of a national award from the American Heart Association for a TV documentary, sponsored by a Detroit station as a public service.

She is holder of a national honor citation, won for a Cancer Crusade kickoff, sponsored by Detroit's Channel 2. "I inherited three big fundraisers for the community center I'll be working on this year," Ms. Masters said. "The ethnic festival, the arts and crafts sale, and the summer antiques show.
