

Summer History Tour Offers EMU Credit

Tickets to the Passion Play and overnight accommodations at Oberammergau are a special bonus for students who join the 11th annual Eastern Michigan University European history tour next summer.

Reinhard Wittke, professor of history and social sciences at Eastern, began the European adventure study sessions in 1959 and has conducted them every summer since then. The Passion Play, presented only every 10 years, was attended by the

history group in 1960.

DEPARTURE from Detroit June 18 is followed by three days in London where a tour of historical sites and tickets to a London theater are included. After flying to Copenhagen, students will see the Tivoli Gardens and Elsinore Castle where Shakespeare's "Hamlet" takes place. A few days in Berlin will include a tour to Checkpoint Charlie and a brief visit to East Berlin.

On July 4, the group will travel to Oberammergau. Sunday, following the performance of the play, the group will return to Munich. Tickets to a play or an opera are included each week in Munich.

Two days in Venice will be followed by a trip along the Yugoslav coast with overnight stops in Opuzja and Split, and two nights in Dubrovnik. A cruise of the Yugoslav Riviera is included.

After two days in Athens, the group will embark on a seven-day cruise of the Greek islands and a stop in Istanbul. Rome, Florence and eight days in Switzerland conclude the session with the return flight to Detroit scheduled from Geneva Aug. 13.

FROM TWO to six credit hours may be earned in the EMU Department of History and Social Sciences. The program is open to graduate students, qualified undergraduates, and guest students from other institutions. Those wishing to audit the program will be admitted as space permits.

The 1970 program offers three options: Plan A includes 40 days of group travel plus 17 days of independent travel for which two credit hours may be obtained. Plan B includes the 40 days of group travel plus the study session in Munich.

In Plan C, students fly directly from Detroit to Munich on June 29, study and participate in the planned activities there, then return to Detroit July 16. Depending on courses selected in Munich, they may earn up to six credit hours.

THIS YEAR Plan A offers two options. Those who wish to spend 40 days with the group and omit the study session in Munich will pay approximately \$1,500 plus about \$100 for fees and tuition for two hours credit. Option II will cost about \$1,550 and will include six days in Munich and the Passion Play.

Plan B, costing about \$1,600 plus fees, covers the entire travel and study session.

Plan C was inaugurated last year and, because of the success reported by all who attended, will be repeated. The cost for this short session is \$60 plus tuition and fees. It includes air fare, all scheduled activities and classes. Meals are not included.

In addition to the Oberammergau trip, tickets to two concerts or operas are included; also a trip up the Tauber River to the medieval city of Rothenburg and another day in Salzburg.
