On Feb. 9, the Oakland Senior Dis-count Prog. in will be at Mercy Cen-ter, 28600 Eleven Mile, Farmington Hills, to sign applicants. Fictures for senior ID cards will be taken. The cards allow seniors to take ad-vantage of discounts ranging from five to 40 per cent on food, clothing, hearing aids, books, household goods and other common Hems.

The project's emphasis on more common items is in keeping with its goal of helping seniors on fixed in-comes stretch their money as far as possible, according to Mary Kinsella, puble information coordinator for the

public information coordinator for the agency.

Since Feb. 14, 1977, the program has enlisted 39,813 of 100,000 Oakland County residents over 60.

"There is a need for the discount program," said Loretta Conway, director of the Gathering Place. "It's good for the members and it's good for the members and it's good for the merchants. It draws more people into their stores with the seniors and their families."


