Patterson said Willets' company, the Cocanic Trade Alliance Council International, is being investigated for fraud after investors complained of being bilked out of as much as \$110,000 in a scheme to lease a cruise ship to proscheme to lease a cruise ship to pro-

mote American trade in the Middle East.

Willet's murder last Thursday in front of a popular Detroit restaurant near the Renaissance Center has hindered the fraud investigation. Patterson said. Willets was reportedly driven to the restaurant by Charles McCellian of Farmington to meet a third party. At the time of the shooting, police said, McClellan was inside the restaurant.
