# Widowed and divorced get growth forum

"Room To Grow," a Sunday afternoon forum for the widowed, divorced and their families will take place at the Jewish Community Center Feb. 25.

The program has been organized by SPACE, a community service of the Greater Detroit Section, National Council of Jewish Women, in co-operation with the JCC.

Detroit Free Press columnist Nickie McWhirter will launch the afternoon's activities with an address. Her talk will be followed by a choice of 10 workshops for adult participants, as well as a program for youngsters.

Men and women who have been widowed or divorced can select sessions which interest them. Topics will include: single parenting, intimacy and relationships, coping with stress and career planning.

A program on parenting for the widowed will be offered, as well as a talk on understanding grief. One workshop, Mostly for Men, will deal with problems facing fathers who are divorced or widowed.

YOUTH PARTICIPANTS, in their own program, Stretch and Grow, will

discover and explore new dimensions of themselves. Professionally led rap sessions, at different age levels, will be coordinated with recreational activities.

Children's programs will focus on enhancing self-images and expanding a youngster's capacity to creatively encounter new experiences. For preschool children, day care services will be available.

The afternoon's activities will begin at 12:15 with registration and hospitality. Workshops will run until 5:30. The program will take place at main branch of the JCC, Maple and Drake Roads in West Bloomfield. A \$5 charge for the family includes children's recreation.

SPACE was organized last spring by the NCJW as a response to the needs of the widowed, divorced and separated in Detroit.

AUDREY WASSERMAN of Livonia, Barbara Cook of Farmington Hills and Chuck Chamel of Detroit are chairmen of the SPACE Forum Committee. Other SPACE programming includes weekly support groups for both the divorced and widowed, the publication of a bi-monthly newsletter and a spring family retreat.

## Hebrew U visitor feted

Eliyahu Honig, director of the department of information and public affairs of Hebrew University of Jerusalem, will be honored at a reception at 8 p.m. Sunday, Feb. 18, in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas L. Klein, 5180 Ponvalley, Bloomfield Hills.

The Michigan chapter of American Friends of Hebrew University will sponsor the event.

Honig was born in Australia to a family that had previously lived in Jerusalem for three generations.

Active in the Australian Zionist movement, he was the Australian representative competing in the 1959 Maccabiah games in Israel. He returned to Australia to carry on his studies at Melbourne University, later working in the poultry science division of the agricultural training department at Melbourne University.

In 1955 he left Australia to immigrate to Israel, joining the administration of the Hebrew University of Jerusalem a year later. He has been associated with the university ever since, serving for many years as director of the department of information and public affairs.

His work at the university has brought him into close contact with Jewish communities in various parts of the world, which he has visited for extended periods, lecturing on Israel and the university.
