Jewish-Catholic Day slated

Dr. Michael Novak will be the guest speaker at the Fourth Annual Jewish-Catholic Day on Thursday, March 8 at Madonna College in Livonia.

Sponsored by the League of Catholic Women of Detroit and the League of Jewish Women of Detroit, the event will feature a noon "petite luncheon" followed by an address by the noted columnist, philosopher, theologian and educator.

Mrs. Esther Rosenblum of Southfield is president of the League of Jewish Women, the umbrella organization for all the Jewish women's groups in metropolitan Detroit.

The League of Catholic Women is the oldest social service organization in Detroit. It operates five social service agencies in Detroit and four Bargain Counter resale shops in the tri-county area. Marilyn Lundy of Grosse Pointe is president.

Mrs. Sander Klein of Southfield and Mrs. Gerald Gattorn of Grosse Pointe are co-chairpersons of the traditional day.

The purpose of Jewish-Catholic Day, according to Mrs. Lundy, is "to foster comradery among Jewish and Catholic women involved in community service,

and to present a good program of interest to both groups."

Dr. Novak, who speaks to the importance of the human spirit and the family in man's relation to government and other forces will discuss "The Family — Out of Favor?"

The current Adjunct Professor at the American Enterprise Institute in Washington, D.C., Dr. Novak formerly taught at Harvard, Stanford, Old Westbury and Syracuse Universities and served as Associate Director for Humanities at the Rockefeller Foundation.

He is the author of 10 philosophical works and two novels, and serves as an associate editor and contributor to several religious and secular journals.

Dr. Novak has worked as a journalist and teacher in Mexico and Italy, and has covered the political campaigns as well as human interest concerns across the country. His column appears in a daily newspaper locally.

Auxiliary Bishop Joseph Imesch of the Catholic Archdiocese of Detroit will deliver the invocation and Rabbi Ephraim Spectre of Adat Shalom Synagogue will offer the benediction.

The Mercieres, the 19-member choral group from Our Lady of Mercy High School in Farmington will perform during the luncheon. Miss Jaffe of the Jewish Welfare Federation will introduce the guest speaker.

There will be no charge for the luncheon and program which are open to the public. Reservations are being taken by the League of Catholic Women at 831-1000.

Community band hosts saxophonist in first of new musical series

Saxophonist Donald Sinta will appear as guest soloist with the Farmington Community Band when the band opens a new series, which will bring outstanding artists to the area.

The concert is set for 8 p.m. Thursday, Feb. 22 in Harrison High School's auditorium. Heralding the artist's appearance, William J. Conroy, speaking for the band, quoted a review from the Cleveland Plain Dealer: "A saxophonist of Sinta's skill and sophistication is a phenomenon."

Sinta, renowned for his skill on the saxophone internationally, is an associate professor of the saxophone at University of Michigan.

Prior to the time he joins the 70-member band in concert, Sinta will give a free "Artists Recital Clinic" that afternoon. The clinic is designed for local music students, regardless of their instrumental preference.

The concert is without charge, given for the cultural and entertainment benefit to persons of all ages.

A ticket, however, will be required and can be obtained by stopping in, or writing to, the Farmington Hills Parks and Recreation Department, 31555 Eleven Mile, 48024.

Because of the anticipated response,

early acquisition of tickets is suggested.

Sinta has been a music professor at Ithaca College in New York, and Hart College of Music in Connecticut. He spent two years with the Detroit Symphony, and has served as chairman for the World Saxophone Congress.

All future concerts in the series will follow the same format of being without charge, but requiring a ticket for admission.

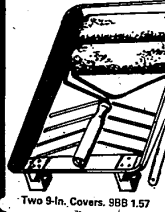
