

Troy High picks football coach

Don't be surprised if this year's Troy High School football team somewhat resembles that of cross-town neighbor Athens. Troy's new head varsity football coach is Jeff Keller, a man modeled by Athens' successful grid coach John Walker. Keller was recently picked from 39 candidates who had applied for former coach Tom Conley's job.

Keller will be assuming his first head coaching position. The 25-year-old coach had been an assistant to Walker for the last three seasons. Keller is looking forward to the challenge of resurrecting the Troy football program.

"I felt extremely lucky

when I was picked to be the coach at Troy," said Keller. "I'm very excited about it. Since I got the job I've been putting in a lot of time. It will be a big challenge for me."

"We won't have an identical program that they have at Athens. The defense will probably be similar, but the offense will differ."

"I believe in multiple defenses — the 53, 62 and the split six. On offense we'll show a variety of formations. I don't believe in running off of one set offense. We have the backs to run different offenses this year."

Keller admires Walker for the way he has been a now-flourishing Redhawk program. Walker is firm in his approach to the

game, but yet realizes the capabilities of his players.

"He (Walker) helped me out a great deal," said Keller. "He has some invaluable traits — he develops character among his players, and he treats them all fairly. That's the type of coach I'd like to be."

KELLER HAD his first pre-season assembly last week. Some 65 Troy students assembled with the hopes of landing a freshman with either the spirit, junior varsity or varsity teams.

Last year the Coit varsity finished with an overall 3-6 record — one win better than their 1977 record. Troy beat Berkeley and Chippewa Valley

last year, and also scored an exciting victory over Clawson.

The Coils will have 20 returning seniors this year. They will also be bolstered by players from last year's junior varsity team, which went undefeated.

"We had 25 freshman out (for the pre-season assembly), and we've contacted 113 ball players," said Keller. "Everyone has a good attitude right now, and things have gotten off to a very good start."

"The Bears Club has been very helpful in getting us off in the right direction," he said.

Keller, who will teach 10th and 11th grade English at Troy, graduated from Alma College in

1974. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree in English, and a minor in physical education.

Keller played three years of varsity football, two years of varsity baseball and two years of varsity basketball at Birmingham Seaholm High School. He played defensive end for two years at Alma, and was a four-year member of the baseball team.

While at Alma, Keller served as a sports information director and head athletic trainer.

KELLER HAS been in the Troy School System for five years. He began at Smith Middle School, and eventually transferred to Athens.

Keller has coached four different sports — baseball, basketball, swimming and football.

"My main job (as coach) will be to develop character and self-confidence, and instill some discipline in my players," he said.

"If the kids continue to improve throughout the season, and they have a good self-concept of themselves, I'll consider that a successful season. They have to discipline themselves both on and off the field — that's just as important as the win-loss record."

"But, we'll try to win right off the bat this year and see what happens," he said.
