The newly elected officers and their council will be installed on the Feast Day of the Church of the Holy Cross, in September.

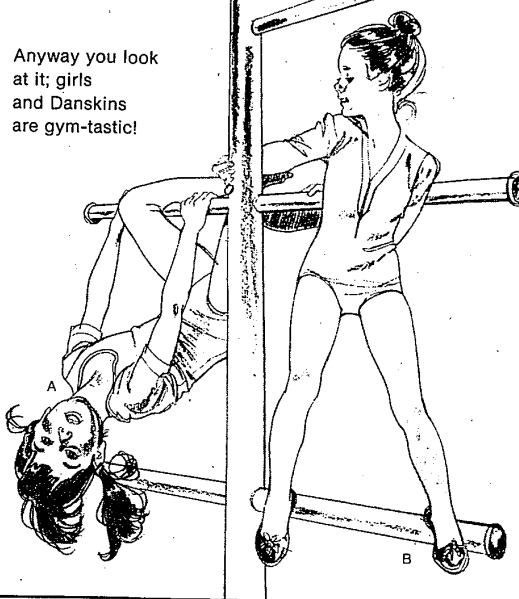
Long-term food storage
