4 more free clinics planned for runners

A second series of free clinics for runners and joggers is planned by Total Runner, an area retail store specializing in running gear.

The clinics offer a chance to hear experts discuss various aspects of running, from getting started as a beginner to racing marathons, from diet tips to stretching exercises.

After panel discussions, time is left for questions and answers.

Total Runner is located in the Franklin Shopping Plaza, Northwestern Highway at 12 Mile Road.

Charlie Blanchard, a Boston-qualified marathoner and managing partner of the store, said, "Our first series, in June and July was more popular than we had expected."

"We held the clinics in the store and had packed houses without much publicity. In August and September, we

may have to move the clinics to an auditorium to accommodate more people."

Consequently, Blanchard asks running and jogging enthusiasts who want to attend the clinics to call ahead so the management will know what arrangements to make.

Reservations and inquiries will be taken by calling 354-1177 for the clinics set for Aug. 15, 29, Sept. 12 and 19.

SOME OF THE TOP distance racers in Michigan will be at the clinic on Aug. 15 for the session called "Training & Racing," which is an introduction to the potential rewards of distance racing.

Participants will learn how to train for races and race strategy. "Running Injuries" is set for Aug. 29 with a panel of experts discussing symptoms, causes, treatment and prevention of injuries and discomforts.

Foot care and shoe selection will also be discussed.

"Marathoning" is the subject for Sept. 12, covering training methods, diet, safety factors and pacing.

The clinic winds up with "Running for Women" on Sept. 19 with special advice given to the novice, a discussion on medical concerns, and advice on how to combine exercising with running.

All clinics begin at 7 p.m. and conclude at approximately 9 p.m.

"I think it is wrong to believe that all knowledge about running is housed in Boston and California," Blanchard said. "We have our own experts in Michigan and I think runners in the Detroit area can benefit from contact with them."

"That's what our clinics are all about."

Fire Alert stickers offered to pet owners

Action, Respect and Kindness (ARK), a humane education service, has issued "Fire Alert" stickers for pet owners who are concerned that in the event of a fire, firefighters know there are a certain number of pets in the house.

ARK's intention is not that any firefighter should endanger his or her life attempting to rescue an animal. Most firefighters look for pets, but the alert sticker will tell exactly how many cats, dogs, or other kinds of animals are inside.

The stickers are designed to be placed on a door or window, filled out

with ballpoint or Magic Marker brand pen.

ARK will send a sticker in return for a request with stamped self-addressed envelope to: ARK, Post Office Box 65, Warren, Mich. 48090. There is no charge, though donations will be welcomed.

The group asks that if the number or variety of pets change after a sticker has been posted that a new sticker be requested. Members believe that no firefighter should have to spend precious time and effort looking for pets that are no longer there.
