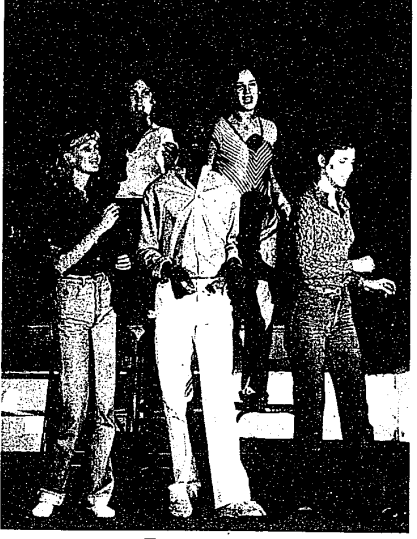

## Carillonner, organist to play

Guest performers Roland Richter and Doris Grapentine will present a music concert at Christ Church Cranbrook, Sunday, Aug. 26.

Richter, Kirk in the Hills carillonner, will play the carillon at 4 p.m., followed by a 5 p.m. organ recital by Doris Grapentine, organist at First United Methodist Church, Royal Oak.

There is no charge for either program. Carillon program will include Richter's "Gothic Prelude" in addition to classic pieces arranged by renowned carillonners 't Hart, Gerken, Myhre and Rusterholz.

Also featured will be Marriotti's "The Suite voor Bezaard," "Prelude No. 3" and "Prelude No. 4" by Van Der

Gheyn and Bender's "Suite for Glockenspiel."

Ms. Grapentine will play organ pieces by 18th and 19th century composers. Richter is a member of the Guild of Carillonners of America. He graduated from the University of Minnesota and earned a masters from the University of Michigan. He studied organ with Arthur Jennings, Edward Berryman

and Paul Manz and studied carillon with Frederick Marriotti.

Programs for Sunday's performances are at the church front door on across Lone Pine in the Cranbrook Gardens booth.

The carillon can best be heard about 200 feet from the church either on the lawn or in cars. The organ recital will be inside Christ Church.

## Artists show at Meadow Brook

"Art at Meadow Brook" will take place on the grounds of Meadow Brook Hall, Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 18 and 19, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

A variety of art media will be shown by the 70 invited artists, from all over Michigan. The inner court yard of the hall is a picturesque atmosphere for displaying and selling art.

The show is sponsored by the Creative Council whose origins were from the Continuum Center of Oakland University, Rochester.

The council was formed 11 years ago to encourage, promote and provide a marketplace for its members. Many council members will be exhibitors.

Admission is free and refreshments may be

urchased at the summer Tea Room in Meadow Brook Hall or the adjacent carriage house.

Weaving, basketry, pottery, sculpture soft and hard, graphics batik, stained glass, gold and silver jewelry, painting, mixed media collage, photography, fiber work, wood carving and miniatures are among the things to be offered for sale.

Meadow Brook Hall is considered one of the most beautiful homes in the state. It will be open to visitors during the art show. There is a charge.

The entrance to the grounds is on Adams just south of Walton Blvd., Rochester.

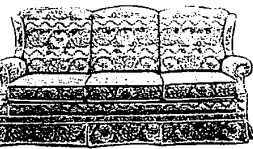

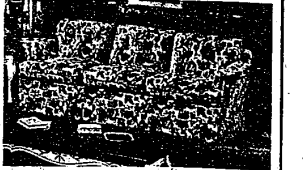
