cabaret), "because I don't have an entertainment license for performing acts, but I can have music, so I could have Count Basie and his 20-piece orchestra?"

"I'm not going to be defeated," she added. "We'd just have to get another great idea. You still have to work and live with it (the city's decisions)."

At Twenny's, Ms. Gill-Davis is also fighting back against some

complaints that the restaurant is snobbish and expensive. She's lowered her prices by offering less expensive cuts of meat but still serves fresh meats and fish, vegetables, salads, all prepared interestingly and tastefully.

EDUCATED PALATES love Twenny's for Ms. Gill-Davis' French specialties and other dishes. They also willingly pay top dollar for her gourmet "carryouts" offered at Yvonne's Cuisine a la Carte, adjoining the cafe.

Twenny's dinner prices, however, seem astonishingly low, compared to recent increases in food and restaurant prices. All dinners there now are a four-course, prix fixe dinner of French foods, for \$15.

There's a choice of cold appetizer (four-five selections); the same with a hot appetizer; a choice of five or six entrees, all served with fresh vegetables, French bread and butter, dessert and coffee.

For lunch, Ms. Gill-Davis said, "There's no minimum. You can have

something for \$2-\$10."

Twenny's also has a liquor license. In addition to wine by the bottle, wine by the glass is available for \$1.50. Ms. Gill-Davis calls her house wines "the best value in town." She alternates between a Spanish, a French burgundy, or California. Before leaving the Royal Oak Farmers Market, she stopped at the fresh flower stall of Nichols Greenhouse from Belleville, selecting two bunches of pink gladiolus for \$3. "I'll put them in the restaurant, on top of the piano," she said.
