

Farmington harriers stretch win streak

Farmington's cross country team improved its dual meet record to 4-0 with a win over Walled Lake Western Thursday and a victory in a double-dual meet against Redford Union and Novi last Tuesday.

Western, the defending Inter Lakes League (ILL) champions, was beaten handsily by the Falcons, 18-39. Farmington's John Murphy finished first in the meet (16:34), with Bill Atkinson second, Dan Brennan fourth, Steve Madonis fifth and Bill Anglin sixth.

In the Falcons' double dual meet win over Redford Union and Novi, the team again claimed five of the top six spots. Murphy again was the top finisher (17:00), with Atkinson second, Madonis third, Dave Denny fifth and Tom Feiten sixth.

Farmington finished with a 17-point total, with Redford Union, second (43) and Novi third (53).

The Falcons travel to Milford Lake-Land for a dual meet Thursday.


