Traffic toll down

August traffic deaths have set a record low for the month, according to the Traffic Improvement Association (TIA) of Oakland County.

The nine recorded fatalities were the lowest the county has experienced for any August since TIA began keeping records in 1967.

The reduction can probably be attributed to fewer miles driven and the fact that deaths historically decline as economic conditions worsen.

The nine fatalities represent a 53 percent decrease compared to the 19 deaths recorded in August, 1978. Year-to-date figures indicate that 101 per-

sons have been killed in traffic through August, marking an 11.4 percent decrease compared to 114 deaths for the same period last year.

Statewide figures indicate a similar reduction. Michigan's August fatality total was 140 compared to 225 for 1978, a decline of 38.8 percent. Year-to-date shows 1,116 persons killed through August, compared to 1,323 for 1978, a decrease of 15.6 percent.

Both Oakland County and statewide fatality totals are provisional because of delayed deaths resulting from traffic accidents.

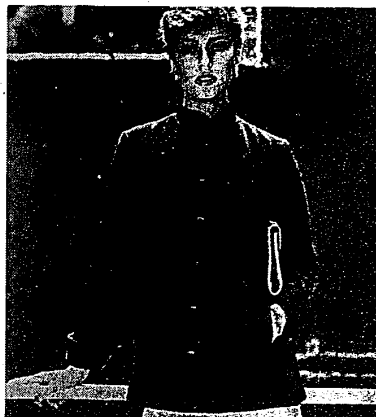
