

Dog obedience training starts for all breeds

Dog obedience training begins for all breeds, at 7 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 4, in American Legion Hall, 31775 Grand River, and continues for 13 Thursdays evenings, sponsored by Metropolitan Dog Obedience Training School.

The requirements are that the dog must be at least four months of age and have proof of distemper vaccination before registrations will be accepted by Valerie Sprader, 851-5088.

"One way to make your dog a good citizen and neighbor is through obedience training," Ms. Sprader said. "A poorly behaved dog is a problem for everyone. Nothing is more frustrating than attempting to corral a dog that will not come when you call."

She continues by saying that the dog with basic manners is not the dog that one will find in animal shelters or pounds.

Teaching a dog to be well-behaved is most easily done when the dog is young and has not acquired bad habits.

"A well-behaved dog is the result of the dog owner being willing to work with the dog regularly in a systematic manner. Obedience classes are time well spent when you consider that the dog will be living with the owner for the next 10 to 12 years," Ms. Sprader said.

The school's motto is "A dog worth owning is a dog worth training."
