

# \$50,000 Payoff Thanks To Boro's Roaring Finish

Most people work four or five years to earn \$50,000. Maybe even longer!

But Julius Boro picked up the \$50 grand over the weekend when he staged a roaring finish, capped by a birdie on the final hole, to win the Westchester Golf Classic.

His final total of 272, 10 under par, slipped by one stroke to Bob Murphy, who had led after the first three rounds, and Jack Nicklaus and Don Sikes. All three came in at 273.

## Waterford Road Races Attract 150

Snyder, who leads the jockey parade with 21 victories, brought home the winners of the first and second races Thursday. Whitely rode both ends of the double on Wednesday.

Whitely, with two decisions Saturday, now has 19. Heath has 15 and Donald Holmes, who set a Hazel Park high with 103 victories this spring, won two Saturday to hold down the fourth position with 14 decisions.

Whitely is the DRC defending champion. His 116 victories over the DRC's 54-day meeting last year are a track and Michigan record.
