Little Maria Okay With New Heart

HOUSTON, TEX. -- Maria Giannaris, 5, of Hagerstown, Md., became the second child in the world to receive a transplanted heart. The Sunday operation lasted almost two hours. The girl is reported to be in satisfactory condition in Texas Children's Hospital.

The heart transplant was performed by a team headed by Dr. Denton A. Cooley. The girl had been a heart patient for several months.

WASHINGTON -- A national task force has recommended stepped-up federal and private efforts to combat use of cigarettes and "stem the rising tide of early deaths and disabilities associated with smoking."

Among the recommendations of the task force to the U.S. Surgeon General:

Tighter restrictions on cigarette advertising and promotion; Better instruction in schools to influence youngsters to refrain from smoking; Greater antismoking efforts by doctors and other health professionals.

Use of group approaches to prevent or reduce smoking; More insurance plans which give reduced rates to non-smokers; and

Development and promotion of safer cigarettes.

The report was immediately attacked by the Tobacco Institute as a "shockingly intemperate defamation of an industry which has led the way in medical research to seek answers in the cigarette controversy."

LANSING -- The Michigan Legislature last week wrapped up details of a new constitutional measure which is likely to increase lawmakers' salaries next year.

The action was to pass legislation putting into effect a State Officers' Compensation Commission approved by the voters as a constitutional amendment at the primary election two weeks ago.

WASHINGTON -- The U.S. balance of payments position in the second quarter of the year was the best it has been in two years, the government reported last week.

Much of the gain shown by the figures was due to special factors, however, officials said, indicating that the basic situation was much more the same as that for the first quarter.

The dollar-draw slowed to about \$150 million during the April-to-June quarter.

This was a sharp reduction from the first quarter when the figure was \$660 million.

LANSING -- Both chambers of the legislature have declared their hostility to what some lawmakers claim is "lowering of standards" in a new move to recruit non-white state police troopers.

In separate actions the House and Senate passed almost identical resolutions expressing "deep concern" and "strongly advising against" the alleged "lowering of standards."

The plan as described by legislators is to recruit equal numbers of white and black trooper candidates who previously failed to pass the written examination, give them oral and physical exams and then recruit school training and measure the results by performances in school and later on the job.

ANNAPOLIS, MD. -- The resignation of Maryland Gov. Spiro T. Agnew's only black staff member has underlined a fear of black dissatisfaction is fermenting within the GOP.

Dr. Albert Ware, Agnew's liaison with the black community, said in a telegram of resignation that he was concerned over the governor's comments on "broad and vital questions of social justice."

LANSING -- Gov. George Romney said that he and other state officials have worked out what they believe is an acceptable agreement with the State Nursing Home Association to save medical patients in Michigan nursing homes from possible eviction.

He said details of the plan were being worked out and when finalized would be made public.

MINN. -- President Lyndon Johnson, less than two weeks away from his 60th birthday, has been given a clean bill of health by his doctors.

Johnson's personal physician, George Burkley, said that on the basis of X-rays taken he feels "there's been no significant change in the president's physical condition since the 1966 X-rays."

CHICAGO -- Plans for an anti-Vietnam war demonstration in Chicago at the same time the Democrats hold their convention next week have been modified because of concern of police reaction to mass nudity.

A notice was posted in a Windy City pub asking for volunteers to march in a "bare breasts for peace brigade" on Aug. 26.

Much to the northern surprise, Worthy N.L. Burbank Jr., a 35-year-old writer and opponent of the war, who started the movement as a joke, received calls from more than 30 willing women who said they would march and would recruit others to join in the fun.

LONDON -- The 7,500 word encyclopedia "Humana Vita" (of Human Life) which was published July 29 has received its most enthusiastic support from the hierarchies of Poland, South America and Southern Europe, a survey by correspondents of the New York Times in various countries has disclosed.

The survey also disclosed the following:

Predictions of substantial numbers of defections from the church as a result of the ruling have thus far proved erroneous.

Most clergymen who have been outspoken critics of the encyclopedia have not been disciplined by their superiors.

In at least one case the publicity surrounding the encyclopedia has led to an increase in the use of birth control pills.
