

Local Congressmen Split On Peace March

Observerland's three congressmen are offering three different reactions to the weekend's planned anti-war demonstrations, which will include people from their districts marching in their headquarters, Washington, D. C.

Combined, they represent most of the spectrum of thought. CONGRESSMAN William Ford (D-15th District), representing Westland and Garden City, is giving qualified support to the "peace minority."

New Anti-War Plans Are Told

Livonia Mall at Seven Mile and Middle Belt will be the scene of an anti-war petition drive Thursday, Nov. 13. The "Committee for Peace" will circulate the forms for residents to use in their home neighborhoods.

Carl Dehaldo Jr. for Stevenson High School and John Goman for Franklin High School, both in Livonia, are co-ordinators of activities scheduled there for Thursday and Friday.

BOTH SCHOOLS are having assemblies either Thursday or Friday during which the Vietnam war will be debated.

Bryant Junior High, also in Livonia, is reportedly planning something similar.

Kuhn Asks State Help For Nixon

LANSING Sen. George W. Kuhn (R-West Bloomfield) has introduced a resolution in the Senate asking "manifest support" of President Richard Nixon's plan to end American participation in the Vietnam war by planned withdrawal of troops from that long-embattled nation.

The resolution, signed by 19 senators, cited President Nixon's Nov. 3 televised speech to the nation in which he gave the background of America's involvement, his futile attempts to work with the Vietnamese and Russians for a negotiated settlement, and his future plans for a withdrawal of American troops "with honor."

It noted that "President Nixon has implemented a 'Vietnamization' plan in which United States forces are withdrawn in direct proportion to the increase in strength of the Vietnam forces in accordance with an orderly timetable." The resolution noted that a "precipitate withdrawal of all American forces from Vietnam would be a disaster for South Vietnam, the United States and the cause of peace."

SEN. KUHN, whose district includes Farmington and Livonia, a World War II navy veteran and a commander in the U.S. Naval Reserve, lauded Nixon's address to the nation and his plan for ending American participation in the conflict.

"Many unthinking, easily-led Americans are blindly following foreign-dominated militant leaders who are bad-mouthing everything American and who are determined to hand Communists of the world a clear-cut victory over the United States," said Sen. Kuhn.

Livonia, Redford Township and Farmington, is giving stout backing to the position of President Richard Nixon, as outlined by Nixon in a televised speech last week in which he called for support from the "silent majority."

Congressman Marvin Esh (R-2nd District), including Plymouth, said he supports the kind of non-violent demonstrations such as those held Oct. 15, but cautions that this week's demonstrators should not be allowed to take a violent turn.

In a statement this week, Esh said, "The demonstrators coming to Washington will be faced with a great responsibility... especially since (the announcement by an administration official) that 5,000 troops have been amassed and the police and National Guard have been alerted," said Ford.

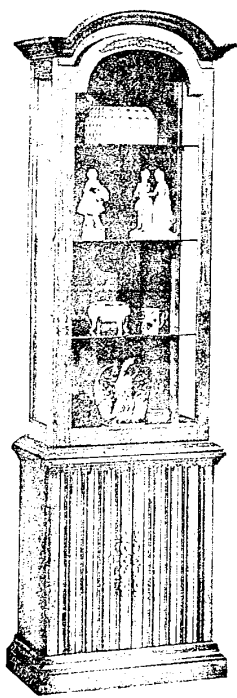
