

Gervasi speaks at Adat Shalom

Frank Gervasi, syndicated columnist, author and foreign correspondent, will be the guest speaker at the Congregation Adat Shalom Tribute Dinner honoring Harold and Phillip Warren at 6:30 p.m. Nov. 6 in the synagogue's social hall, in Farmington Hills.

The dinner will be conducted on behalf of State of Israel Bonds. The Warren brothers are long-time leaders in

the congregation and community. They will receive the State of Israel Lion of Judah Peace Award.

Gervasi achieved prominence during World War II for his coverage of the major fighting fronts. He was associate editor of Collier's and after the war served the U.S. State Department as Chief of Information in Home for the Marshall Plan. His syndicated column

on world affairs, distributed three times a week by the World Wide Press Service has appeared in major newspapers throughout the country.

He is a former director of the Mediterranean area for the Motion Picture Export Association of America.

Vicariate studies ballot questions

The Farmington Southfield Vicariate, an association of pastoral ministers of the local Roman Catholic vicariate, make the following endorsements regarding the Nov. 6 election in Farmington Hills.

The vicariate recommends a vote on Proposition A, the bonding proposal. It believes housing financed by general obligation bonds would not serve the senior citizens that need housing assist-

ance the most.

It recommends a yes vote on advisory question 1: do you favor the acceptance of federal rent subsidies at city sponsored housing developments for needy families and needy senior citizens.

The vicariate recommends a vote on advisory question 2: in the absence of availability of federal rent subsidies for the city sponsored housing develop-

ments, do you favor levying up to three mills on the city tax rolls for that purpose.

It recommends a yes vote on advisory question 3: are you in favor of the city's mid-rise zoning ordinance which permits the city council to rezone land for elderly housing, up to 60 feet in height, if such land is not located in an area planned as predominantly single family residential.
