The road that led Carlos Falchi to a successful career in fashiom was marked with many detours. Once, he did a three-month stint as busboy in Miami, then went a similar route in upstate New York hotels. His entry into the sophisticated world of fashion was more accidental than planned, he said.

"I worked for a film company and carmed very little. One day my wife, Mary, went out and came back with a belt that she wasn't really happy with, but it was the best she could find. I made her return it and we went out to-

She loved the belt, he said, and as luck would have it so did his boss, who just happened to also own a boutique. "He asked me to do some belts for him," Falchi said. "Alter filling his order, I made five more belts with the remaining leather and I sold them within the week. And that's where it all started."

AT THIS POINT Falchi got the in-spiration for his first handbag. "It was absolutely beautiful and I became so

enthusiastic that I decided to try a skirt for Mary. I really felt an affinity with leather and I was inspired to explore the possibilities of working with vari-ous skins."



Falchi's efforts with silk kaftans caught the eye of a musician friend, Airto Moreira, a percussionist with jazz impressionist Miles Davis, who hired Falchi to design his stage wardrobe.

"Miles Davis was a unique experience. We became friends and I learned a lot from him, as I have from everyone who has crossed my path over these years," said the fashion start.

Through Davis, Falchi began making costumes for Tina Turner, Mick Jagger. The Grateful Dead, Flora Purim and Maria Lucien of Bow-Bow Productions in New York.

As Falchi's borizons expanded, he de-cided to concentrate on the creation of new leather designs. His style is based on an Art-Deco motif that can be multi-plied into many pattents by combining the natural colors of the skins and their unique shapes within the space of a giv-en format.


