Super boom ends;'80s look tough for real estate

"Brace yourself," economist Anthony Downs told a roomful of suburban real estate advisors and lenders.

The real estate "super boom of the last four years" is over. The first three last four years is over. The first three duraters of 1980 will be tough in the housing industry. While "demand for single-family houses will not collapse," Dr. Downs said, the old adage of housing depreciating like any other durable good may yet prove true.

"You may feel threatened," he said recently in a speech that had to be depressing to his audience in Fairlane Manor, Dearborn. "But consider the average Cambodian or even citizen of Iran."

DOWNS IS a senior fellow at the Brookings Institution, a private non-profit research organization on public policy issues in Washington and a for-

mer faculty member (economics, political science) at the University of Chica-

Downs said that in the 1930 election

year, the government would try to attack the problems of inflation and recession simultaneously — "and fail to do both."

The Federal Reserve Board's moves in October to raise interest rates should have slowed down the rise in housing rates — but didn't.
"Nothing bore the brunt, and the economy didn't slow down," he said.

"THE SAVINGS and loans cannot hold savings from leaving for greener pastures," Down went on, predicting money would leave the institutions which provide so much housing mortgage money and that Detroit area saving and loan institutions would continue to lose funds.

One reason the supply of mortgage

money is down is that Americans simply aren't saving, he said. They apparently regard the increase in their housing equity due to inflation as a form of saving and aren't salting away money in thrift institutions.

Mortgage interests rates, now running at more than 14 percent, will stay high until at least the third quarter of 1980.

And the Fed must keep interest rates high, he said, in order to keep big for-eign deposits here and because rising oil prices keep worsening America's balance of payments, even if Ameri-cans don't consume more.

HOUSING PRICES reached a peak last July, when the average price in the north central states reached \$52,400, Downs said.

how much more they'll slip is an open question.

"House prices are declining com-pared to what sellers had hoped to get in their moments of wildest optimism. But prices are not — yet — below what they (sellers) would have gotten one year earlier."

Downs said that in the western Wayne and Oakland market, prices in October averaged \$52,900, some 4 per-cent below the July peak but still 8 per-cent ahead of the October 1978.

But if prices continue to slide at the current rate, Downs said, by February 1980 they will be below prices of Feb-ruary 1979.

"By the end of the first quarter of 1980, many prices will be below a year earlier. In many respects, that is a healthy development."
