QUESTION: I have heard that my dog can get worms from eating can-dy. Is that true?

ANSWER: While we would nerer advise feeding your dog candy, it
is not true that worms will result
from doing it.
Worms and other internal parasites are generally transmitted by
infection of the puppy from the
mother before or after it is born or
by ingeston (eating) of parasite eggs
that are passed in the stool of an infected animal and remain in the
stool and on the ground for long periods of time.

QUESTION: I have an 8-year-old wirehaired fox terrier that has de-veloped a small red bump on its neck. It has been there for several months and does not seem to be growing or bothering her. What do you think it is?

ANSWER: It could be a papillo-ma, a type of benign tumor which older dogs often develop. We recommend you have it checked when your dog is in for rou-tine examination or vaccinations or sooner if it is growing or starts bothering the dog.

QUESTION: How often do dogs ome into heat?



ANSWER: Most female dogs will come into heat the first time be-tween six months and one year and then approximately every six months thereafter.

There is great variation. Some cycles last as short as five months and some as long as 18 months.

The period of estrus or heat lasts for 21 days from the first signs of swelling or bleeding.


