

Luncheons lighten mundane Mondays

For the next three weeks Barbara Dermody and Judy Antishin will prepare lunch for 40 at the Farmington Community Center.

Their first installment of the "Luncheon Series by Barb and Judy" last Monday afternoon was the result of about four days of planning on the part of the Center's two expert cooks.

The luncheon series replaces a cooking lesson which was canceled because of small enrollment. But Community Center administrators are looking toward the future when hungry noon-time visitors could provide a stable point in the facility's budget.

Betty Paine, executive director of the center is taking a wait-and-see attitude about the possibility of the center going into the luncheon business on a full-time basis.

At the moment, she hopes the limited Monday series offering tastes of fresh seasonal foods will draw more persons into the center on Farmington Road near 10 Mile.

Cooking for a large group has become almost second nature for Mrs. Dermody and Mrs. Antishin.

Mrs. Antishin, with hobbies of reading and collecting cookbooks, receives a daily dose of cooking larger quantities when she dishes up dinner for her six children.

She cooked and presented two Christmas dinners on the same day this year and has catered her family's graduations.

"THERE'S always about 150 people," she says. "We rent a tent and I use my own dinnerware."

Her dinnerware includes mammoth salad bowls suited to serving larger dinner parties. One of her "smaller" salad bowls is pressed into service for the Monday series at the Farmington

Community Center. Last Monday's menu set the standard for the following series. Soup and salad

will accompany a main dish. Next Monday, the luncheon series will follow an Italian theme.

The series luncheon is designed to be about \$4 a person. Dessert is extra. Fruit and cheese will also be available.

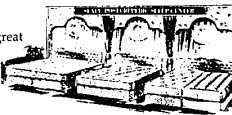

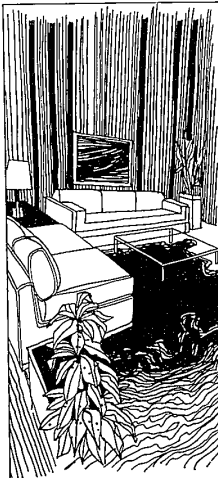
