

Quakertown DAR sponsors 7 'Good Citizens'

Quakertown Chapter Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) sponsors seven high school seniors this year who have been selected by their school as best fulfilling the qualities required for the honor of being named "DAR Good Citizen."

All are automatic contenders for the state competition when 10 finalists will be guests of Michigan State Society's Award Day meeting.

A total of 536 schools in Michigan participate in the contest.

Those sponsored by DAR chapters throughout the state must have qualities of leadership, dependability, service and patriotism.

Leadership includes personality, self-control and the ability to assume responsibility. Dependability includes truthfulness, loyalty and punctuality. Service includes cooperation, courtesy, and consideration of others. Patriotism includes unselfish interest in family, school, community and nation to an outstanding degree.

DAVID HAWTHORNE, who shot a 69 on an 18 hole round of golf at Kensington Country Club, takes the DAR Good Citizen Award from Harrison High School. He is an all-state Class A golfer who holds a 3.6 point grade average as well as a host of golf and tennis awards.

John McGowan, a Birmingham resident, is president of the student council at Brother Rice. He is a member of the school's players and sings with the Brother Rice-Marian Concert Choir. He is active in a number of sports, but what is most important to him is his participation in spiritual meetings, organized by an order of priests called the Legionnaires of Christ.

Sue Heinlen from Bloomfield Hills attends Our Lady of Mercy High School where she is a science club officer and uses off-school hours for volunteer work at Henry Ford Hospital. She holds two-part time jobs, one waitressing, the other assisting in her father's dental office in Farmington Hills.

Denise Branham is a cheerleader at George Schafer High School in Southgate, a members of her school's marching band and symphonic band and a regular participant in the Mothers March on Muscular Dystrophy.

Joanna Cross, from St. Clair Shores, is vice president of her school's Student Congress, a member of Junior Achievement, and a worker for UNICEF and United Foundations.

Eagle Scout Jeffrey Aichenbaum responds to calls from charity groups to perform his tricks of magic and his expertise in juggling. The Oak Park youth belongs to a number of magician's societies, the American Jewish Action and the American Zionist Youth Foundation.

Michelle DeChene is editor for Romulus High School's newspaper, has participated in Girl's State and is a member of Dearborn's Sing-Out. She works part time as a cashier for Kmart.

WINNER OF the State Good Citizen Award will win a \$100 bond from the National Society and a \$50 bond from the State Society. Second place winner will receive a \$75 bond, and eight runners-up will receive \$50 bonds.

Michigan Good Citizens will compete with winners of other states with their questionnaire, transcript of grades and

personal recommendations for the national award of a \$1,000 scholarship to the college of his or her choice.

The national winner will also receive a sterling silver Paul Revere bowl, engraved "National DAR Good Citizen 1980."
