Workshop for job hunters makes the search easier

Representatives from Career Advancement Center will come to Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic Church for a 'Job Hunter's Workshop.' The first session of the 10-hour workshop will run from 7-10 p.m. Tuesday, Jan. 29. It will conclude Saturday, Feb. 2, at 4 p.m.

The seminar is designed for those who are anticipating a job change, or looking for a job now. Sponsors of the program believe that today's job seeker must be well-versed in resume writing, job prospecting and interviewing if they expect to get results. An in-depth study of these facets, plus ways of discovering openings before others even know they exist, comprise the workshop. Participants will be critiqued in resume writing.
