# Nominate Teeples For Award

FARMINGTON Two local police officers have been nominated by a University of Detroit law professor for a national civil rights award.

Alan Sultan, also a Farmington Township resident, nominated city Patrolman Murray Switzer and township Det. Earl Teeples for the Jerome Frank memorial award.

The award consists of \$1,000 and a scroll of honor. It is awarded to police officers who have "exemplified the high ideals expressed in the Bill of Rights."

TEEPLES, a township detective sergeant, talked with two of his colleagues in the City of Farmington police department.

"Notwithstanding this pressure," he testified, "this was, in part, due to his strong convictions, as he told me, that 'no man is above the law.' In so doing, he has also exemplified the highest tradition of police administration necessarily associated with a free society.

"Both of these men clearly understand the fact that a police officer must obey the law not only because he is a citizen, but also because he must set an example for all others, most particularly our children.

"Since he carries the power of the state with him wherever he goes, his arduous tasks demand exacting performance. The example these two gentlemen set in discharging that performance motivates my nominating them for your consideration."

SELECTION OF the award's recipient will be made by a panel consisting of: Ramsey Clark, former U.S. Attorney General; Stephen Kennedy, former police commissioner of

New York City; Morris Ermat, former general counsel of the American Civil Liberties Union; and Norman Dorsen, New York University professor.

Sultan said the fact that Switzer was cleared of criminal guilt was not a factor in his nominations.

"What motivated them (Teeples and Switzer) was not to find anyone guilty but to protect the integrity of their profession," he explained, "because they knew they were doing the right thing."

IN NOMINATING Switzer, Sultan wrote: "Prior to Det. Switzer's appearance (at the trial) he was under great pressure from virtually the entire police department of Farmington Township, as well as many of his colleagues in the City of Farmington police department.

"Both of these men clearly understand the fact that a police officer must obey the law not only because he is a citizen, but also because he must set an example for all others, most particularly our children.
