City Retains Boundary Expert

FARMINGTON
The City of Farmington has
retained a municipal law ex-
pert to assist in presenting the
city's arguments to the State
Boundary Commission regard-
ing Farmington Township's
incorporation petition.

At its last meeting, the coun-
cil approved the appointment
of attorney Burton R. Shifman
as special assistant to City
Attorney Robert Kelly on the
Boundary Commission matter.

IT WAS the consensus of the
council, explains City Manager
John Dinan, that because the
incorporation question was
"such an important matter and
involves technical legal debate
and since there is such a short
period of time to advance ar-
guments regarding this issue,"

Shifman should be hired to as-
sist Kelly in meeting the dead-
lines.

Shifman, who specializes in
municipal law, was municipal
judge in Oak Park for 12 years
and counsel for the Oak Park,
Royal Oak and Ferndale school
districts.

SHIFMAN WILL be paid on
a time basis, Dinan explained,
which will be controlled by
how involved the city be-
comes. "Each move we make
will be reviewed by the city
council," Dinan added.

Each of the four governmen-
tal units and the petitioners
have been given until Dec. 3 to
submit written arguments to
the Boundary Commission and
until Dec. 10 to provide writ-
ten rebuttals.

The Boundary Commission
is expected to make a decision
on the township's incorporation
request at its Dec. 17 meeting.
