

# Pen and ink artist featured in library's one-woman show

Nancy Davis Mudloff, whose pen and ink drawing of the Farmington Community Center has been officially adopted as the center's letterhead, has her work on exhibit in a one-woman show in the Farmington Hills Community Library on 12 Mile Rd.

The center's brochure, which carries the listing of spring classes, bears the new logo that will appear on all of its future stationery.

Ms. Mudloff's show includes pen and ink drawings, watercolors and some works combining both forms.

One of the larger watercolors, "Trees and Leaves," was last seen publicly in the Farmington Artists Club juried exhibit last fall in Mercy Center, where it received an honorable mention.

Another of the paintings, "Land-scape Gold," received an honorable mention in the club's Artists' Choice voting the previous fall.

Ms. Mudloff has been active in the Farmington Artists' Club since she joined the group in 1975. She has held several board positions, and was general chairman of last fall's show.

Currently she is chairman of the Picture Lady Program and is a co-chair for the club's educational activities.

BOTH of these positions fall under the scope of the Farmington Art Foundation, the service arm of the club. The Picture Lady Program is the art appreciation program designed for youngsters who attend Farmington elementary public schools.

Ms. Mudloff has been teaching pen and ink drawing since last fall in the Farmington Community Center.

"Last fall one of my beginning students drew, and has printed, a very professional looking Christmas card," she said.

"Another student, an accomplished artist who wished to improve her pen

and ink skills, had some of her drawings printed and has been selling them with much success."

Ms. Mudloff is a graduate of Western Michigan University's School of Teaching where she majored and minored in art.

She has been affiliated with Gallerie II and Old Village Gallery, and most recently was a member and co-owner of Spectrum Gallery in Farmington Hills' Chatham Mall.

"The time involved in running the gallery was too demanding combined with other activities," she said. "I'm looking for a new gallery affiliation now."

Meanwhile, she continues to exhibit in local and statewide juried competitions.

Her work will remain on display in the Quiet Room of Farmington Hills Community Library through the end of this month.

Sessions run Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings for the four year olds, or in the afternoons for the four and five year olds.

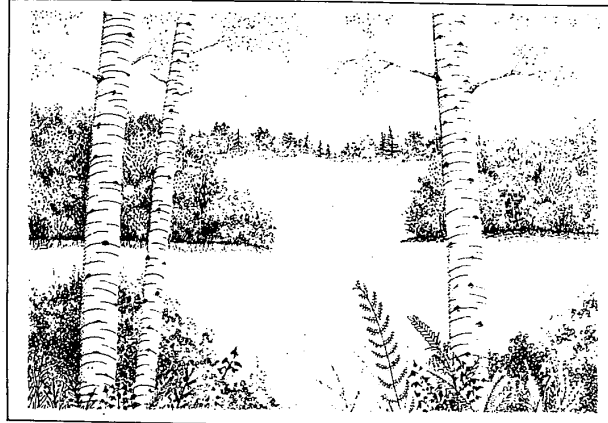
Children who are three can attend Tuesday and Thursday mornings, or choose the Tuesday and Thursday session for those three and four years of age.
