

Police investigate double slaying

However, police downplayed the importanced drugs in the case.

"As far as drugs are concerned, we aren't really interested in whether they're drugs or not," Scott said, "it won't make any difference in the prosecution of this case unless we find it necessary to extablish a drug connection."

MRS. FREEDMAN, 29, was found on the sofa with a jacket partially covering her head. Freedman, 39, was face down on the floor. There were no signs of a struggle, Scott said.
"Drug paraphernalia lay on the floor the living room, which would make us believe there were drugs involved." Scott said. A large amount of a white powdery substance, suspected to be cocaine, was found in containers throughout the home, according to police.
