In-person registration for the Farmington Community Center's spring session will be 1-4 p.m. Thursday. Many of the instructors will fill the center's living room with displays of their craftsmanship.

In-person registration continues on March 16. Registrations will be taken on a first come first served basis. Phone and mail registrations will be accepted next week until the classes are filled.

Classes at the center are designed to attract the attention of crafters from eight to 80.

Cake decorating for junior and senior high school students will meet for five 90-minute sessions beginning at 4 p.m. April 2. Kitty Foylack, widely known for her wedding cakes and culinary expertise, will instruct the class.

In "Model Rocketry" Harry Neuman will introduce the world of rockets. Single stage, multi-stage and engine clustering will be explored. There will be a final flying session to which parents will be invited. Neuman is an emissions engineer at Ford Motor and an active member of Great Lakes Association of Rocketry. His classes will run for five sessions beginning April 3.

"MODEL AIRPLANES," a new class designed for ages eight and older, starts 4:30-5:30 p.m. April 5. Pat Brennan will teach the class to construct four models including the Sig-A.M.A. and other balsa models. Brennan is an active member of the Academy of Model Aeronautics and a radio control modeler.

"Fly Tying and Fly Fishing for Trout," come to the center for nine sessions from 7:30-9:30 p.m. beginning April 4. Instructor Dale Crawford is a member of Trout Unlimited and the United Fly Tyers. He'll cover methods of stream angling, trout-related entomology and fishing for steelhead and salmon.

Barbara Dermody has been teaching adult educational cooking classes and

has collected recipes in Canada, the U.S. and Europe. Ms. Dermody comes to the center with a class titled "Cooking with Class" from 1-3 p.m. for six sessions beginning April 10.

Students will learn the secrets of souffles, omelettes, soups, gourmet meats and party foods.

Mildred White brings "Swedish Strawcraft" to the center for beginners or the advanced student. Class will fashion Christmas decorations, the Kitchen Witch and the Mordford, a Scandinavian house blessing. It will meet for two sessions from 9:30 a.m.-2:30 p.m. April 19 and 26.

"SUMI-E-JAPANESE Greeting Cards" is a Zen art form that creates an artistic mood with a few quick brush strokes. Instructor Mary Bowman has studied with the Zen masters in Japan. She has a fine arts degree from Antioch College. Classes will meet from 9:30 a.m. to noon, May 11.

Becky Magnus will help travelers make their own luggage in her class "Soft Luggage" from 10 a.m. to noon April 30. Students will make soft, waterproof and monogrammed luggage. A round duffel bag, garment bag, cosmetic utility bag and tote bag are listed as class projects. Ms. Magnus is a member of the Needlework and Textile Guild of Michigan.

Zabel Arakelian will teach "Needle Lace," the technique of making lace with a needle and thread. Her class will meet from 9:30-11:30 a.m. for six sessions beginning April 30.

"Silk and Metal Thread Embroidery" class begins from 1-3 p.m. for four sessions beginning April 30. This class will deal with the art of applying silk and metal threads to fabric.

Carol Corbelle will conduct a five part workshop. She is a graduate of Wayne State University with a major in psychology. Ms. Corbelle is working on her masters degree in human sexuality.

"You Can Be Assertive" is the name of her April 23 class. Students will learn to express their wants and feel-

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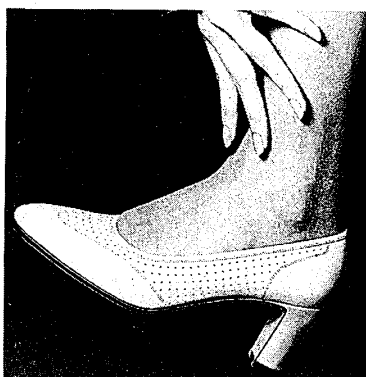
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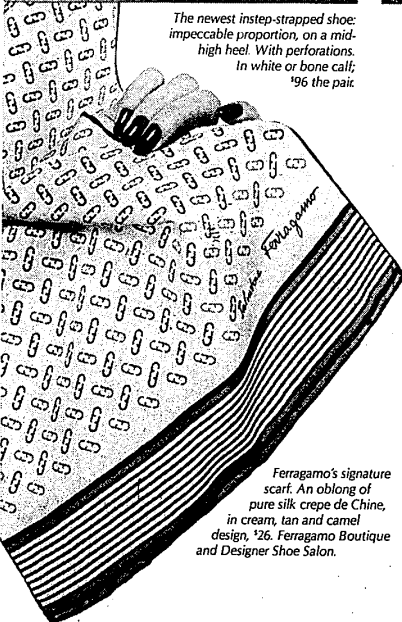
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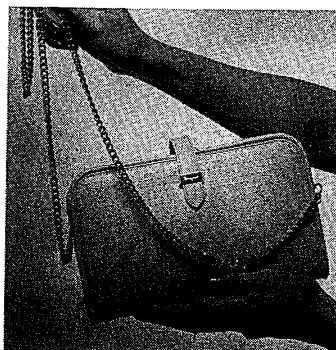
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
