Performers are judged on a solo performance for 50 points; memorization of scales, 25 points, and sight reading, 25 points of total of 85 points or more is required for a Number One rating.

son Fish, an 11th grade violinist; Lisa Marrich, a 10th grade flutist; and Da-vid Londal, a 10th grade trombonist.




