Career change is course topic

The Continuum Center for Adult Counseling and Leadership Training will hold a six-session program April 24 through May 29 for men and women who need additional information before making a change in their working lives.

Careers in Transition, designed for people who are considering an educational or vocational change, will be held 7:30-10:30 p.m. Tuesdays at the Michigan Center for Continuing Education, 900 Auburn Road, west of Opdyke, in Auburn Heights.

Judy Schneider of Franklin, a Continuum Center Counselor, will lead the program along with a staff of trained group leaders.

Participants will be offered a decision-making framework within which various areas can be explored: returning to work or school, changing jobs, redefining educational and vocational goals or thinking ahead to retirements.
