The 12th annual "Christmas in Song" will be presented by the vocal music department of Dunckel Junior High School at 8 p.m., Dec. 12 and 13 in the school auditorium. Directed by Edgy E. Ellingood, the concert will feature the 250 voices of the mixed, girls' and boys' choir.

A special attraction will be the presentation of the traditional cantata, "Song of Christmas," written by Roy Ringwald. The cantata follows the birth of Christ in narrative and song. Soloists for the presentation will be Linda Girolami, Joy Flehman, Beth Hitchcock, Shawn Sullivan, John Knock and Don Taylor. Don Howell At Seminar

Don Howell, director of Federal programs for Farmington Schools, was one of 21 from across the nation to attend a recent evaluation seminar at Indiana University in Bloomington.

Sponsored by the U.S. Office of Economic Opportunity, the seminar was conducted by Dr. Carl Smith through the measurement and evaluation center in reading education. Purpose of the conference was to discuss procedures and techniques for development and subsequent evaluation of federal programs. One major undertaking was a critique of "Taxonomy of Evaluating Techniques for Reading Programs" before its publication.

Howell attended group discussions on "Needs of Evaluators," "Logic of Evaluation Plans," and a number of simulation exercises followed by evaluations and appraisals.
