No matter how rushed Britons are in the morning, they always spare a few moments for the last delicious morning mouthful of toast and marmalade. And sometimes, they even wonder how did it come to be so-called with such a tongue-twisting name. One authentic theory is that the word came from the Portuguese marmelo -- quince -- from the Latin melleolum, which in turn derives from the two Greek words, meli -- meaning honey and melon -- meaning apple. The original preserve, in fact, was made from quince with the addition of honey or sweet wine, and the name remained even when the contents changed to oranges. In this age of packaged foods, marmalade is the one preserve that many British housewives still make at home.
