Redford Youth Killed On X-Way

Thrown from the car in which he was a passenger, John Matthew Butterworth, 18, of 19789 Wakeland, Redford Township, was killed late Wednesday, Nov. 26, on I-66 just west of Farmington.

A car driven by Thomas Schroeder, 19, of 15328 Mayfield, Livonia, ran off the road, hit an exit sign, and rolled over three times, according to State Police reports.

The driver and a second passenger Sandra D'Annunzio, 18, of 19705 Fox, Redford Township, were taken by ambulance to Botsford Hospital, Farmington, where they were treated and released.

Funeral services for Butterworth include a rosary service at 3 p.m. Sunday, in Charles Step Funeral Home, 18425 Beech Daly, Redford, and a 9 a.m. service Monday at the funeral home prior to the service at 9:30 a.m. in St. Agatha Church, on Beech Daly north of Grand River.

Survivors are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Matthew Butterworth, and two sisters, Mrs. Walter Mulligan, and Mrs. Raymond Maliszewski, both of Redford.

Butterworth was a 1969 graduate of Redford Union High School.

Troops To Hear Calls From Mom

Christmas bells will come in the form of telephone calls for thousands of servicemen and women stationed overseas this year.

The Communications Workers of America (CWA-CIO) will again sponsor a "Sit Mom" program which allows overseas servicemen to have a few minutes chat with their families back home.

Henry Even, vice president of C.W.A., Local 4015, said 150 moms, wives and sweethearts of servicemen will be selected in this area.

Even said although moms get top priority, anyone living in this area who has a son, daughter, husband or sweetheart overseas is eligible.

Entries for this 13th annual program must be received by Dec. 8. Those wishing to participate should send their name and address on a postcard to Communications Workers of America, Local 4015, P.O. Box 141, Plymouth, 48170.

The winning names will be drawn and announced on Dec. 12 so that winners may be notified and arrangements made in time for the holiday calls.

In addition to calls sponsored by CWA locals, the International Union will provide 150 calls to servicemen and women in other countries, and another 100 will be made to wounded Americans confined in military hospitals.
