Handy for gifts and holiday needs, the candy items can also be served as elegant sauces and used in other creative cooking applications.

Not an advance order sale, Y-teens will offer immediate delivery of gourmet milk chocolate bars, minted chocolate creams called Tyroleans, and wolly doodles, caramel-peach chocolate covered candies. Boxes are \$1 and bars 50 cents each.

The Detroit Symphony has been the official orchestra of the annual Worcester Festival for the past 10 years. Alfred Nash Patterson, director of the chorus, will conduct the "Messiah" performance in Detroit.
Other guest participants will include Susan Belling, soprano; Joan Kaplan, contralto; Kenneth Fliegel, tenor; and David Cizdrowsky, baritone.
