"The part I enjoy most is cut(ing and getting the colors and grains mached." La Porte said. "I prefer to use all one manufacturer's glass for a piece. It makes for a prettier window." Along with a consistancy of grains, this means that the quality of glass will be the same in a piece. Hardness of glass varies from one manufacturer to another.

"The Germans produce a lot of terrific glass and it's softer than domestic
glass," he said.

the lead used in earlier times, when the tape is around each piece, he puts flux over the total work and then solders. The solder adheres to the copper tape, but not the glass. Both sides are soldered for additional stability.

LA PORTE estimates that he puts about 20 hours work into a medium-sized window or panel.

sized window or panel. He feels fortunate because, as he be-gan to consider glass as more than a hobby, interest in glass picked up dra-matically. His studio, being next to the dental lab, has also been a boon to maintaining two careers. La Porte has a few students who come by the studio regularly to use the facility and get help from him.
