

Garett Gallery's art show brings the winners together

"The Winners Show," displaying paintings, sculpture and pottery by 10 Michigan artists who have gained national and international recognition, continues in Garrett Gallery and Studios, 33310 Grand River, Farmington. It is the first major show for the Garrett, which brings together the state's biggest award winners for the exhibit during May.

LOUIS G. REDSTONE, whose goal is to bring good art into architecture, comes to the show, after winning the 1978 Gold Medal of the Michigan Society of Architects, the highest honor the society bestows.

He is the author of four books on art and architecture. He has been honored with the Patron Award from Michigan Foundation for the Arts and serves on the Special Commission on Art in State Buildings, an appointment by Governor William Milliken.

JOHN GLICK, is the recipient of six grants, including two National Endowments for the Arts grants for his pottery. He has won the Michigan Foundation for the Arts Governors Award and been named Farmington Artist in Residence.

He was commissioned by Joan Mondale for dinnerware for the vice president of the U.S. and is featured in a film, "John Glick, an Artist and His Work," commissioned by Michigan Foundation for the Arts.

RAY FROST FLEMING is a first prize winner in "Watercolor U.S.A." and won first prize for three consecutive years in Michigan Watercolor Exhibition.

IGOR BEGININ's work has been accepted in 12 national art exhibitions and has done five covers for the Detroit Free Press Sunday Magazine. His work can be found in the major collections of Chrysler Corporation and

Ford Motor Company, and in Renaissance Center.

KEGHAM TAZIAN's work hangs in the U.S.S.R.'s permanent collection in Yerevan Museum, and has been included in the National Texas Traveling Exhibit and the Michigan Art Council Traveling Show.

DEREK WERNHER's major commissions have come from Hilton Hotels, Campbell Ewald, Bissell Corporation, Big Sky of Montana, Chrysler Corporation, and Giffels Association. He is best known for his "Sculptural Essay and Portrait of Chet Huntley."

JOHANNA HAAS, a watercolorist and oil painter who has an exhibition running in Germany this summer, has had numerous one-woman shows, both nationally and internationally.

MARY JANE BIGLER, recently retired art professor at Wayne State University, is now teaching at Birmingham Bloomfield Art Association. Twenty select artists will study under her on a tour to Positano, Italy, this summer.

WILLIAM TALL, JR., art critic for Detroit Free Press, shows watercolors. He is art coordinator for Birmingham Schools, and a teacher at Seaholm High School.

LINDA MENDELSON has been on the faculty of Wayne State University since 1971 and teaches at Oakland Community College.

Her awards have come from Michigan Water Color Society Exhibitions, Hartland and Michigan annual shows. She is also holder of the Silver Medal, given by the Scarab Club.

Admission to the show is free.
