

# Miss Farmington entries are due for 1979 pageant

Applications are now available for local young women interested in entering the 1979 Miss Farmington Scholarship Pageant.

The sixth-annual Scholarship Pageant is open to women from 17-26 years of age who have been residents of Farmington and Farmington Hills since Jan. 1, 1979, and have never been married.

One of the most popular events of the annual Farmington Founders' Festival, the winner of the Miss Farmington Scholarship Pageant will advance to the Miss Michigan Pageant and possibly even go on to compete in the Miss America Pageant.

Contestants will be judged on personality, poise, talent, swimsuit and evening gown presentations by a panel of qualified judges. The women entering the contest will participate in special workshops and seminars prior to the competition.

They'll receive instruction in personal grooming, talent performance and modeling and interviewing techniques. Several former Miss Farmingtons will be on hand to offer tips and personal

advise based on their own experience in the pageant.

Miss Farmington will receive scholarship money and wardrobe allowance as well as an assortment of other fine gifts. First and second runners-up, in addition to the winner of the talent competition, also will receive cash prizes and gifts.

Holly Ann Schmidt, Miss Farmington of 1976, was named Miss Michigan of 1977, and went on to represent the state in the Miss America Pageant later that fall.

Miss Farmington of 1978, Pamela Allison Prichard, who was selected during last year's festival, will be in the Miss Michigan Pageant June 16 in Muskegon. The Miss Farmington Scholarship Pageant is a franchise of the Miss Michigan and Miss America Pageants.

Entry forms for the 1979 Miss Farmington Scholarship Pageant, which will be held July 26 at Vladimir's in Farmington, are available from the Farmington Area Chamber of Commerce, 23715 Farmington Road at Grand River. The deadline for entering is Friday, June 1, 1979.

# Young Artists winners perform with Oakway

The four musicians who captured the top spots in Oakway Symphony Orchestra's spring scholarship competition will be featured during the symphony's

last concert of the season.

The concert begins at 8 p.m. Saturday, May 19 in Madonna College, located on Levan at the Jeffries Freeway in Livonia.

Top winner of the "Young Artists" competition was Sue Synestvedt, who has played her violin with the East York Symphony in Toronto and the International Symphony.

The scholarship student with David Cerone at Cleveland Institute of Music will perform the concerto, "Glazounov."

Kirk Toth will perform the Violin Concerto by Brahms. The first runner-

up in the competition is a recipient of the School of Music Stanley Medal, and a member of the Richard, Va., Sinfonia and Rochester Philharmonic of New York.

Alan Onglengco, second runner-up, holds a host of awards, most recently from the state Solo and Ensemble Festival, where he received the perfect score of 100 with a piano solo.

Onglengco will perform Chopin's Piano Concerto.

Paul Wingert will play a cello concerto by Saint-Saens. He is the assistant principal cellist with the Toledo Symphony Orchestra.

THE ARTISTS are all under 25, a prerequisite for eligibility in the competition.

General admission to the concert is \$5, or \$2 for students and senior citizens.

Advance tickets are available at Hudsons, Northland, Westland and Oakland Mall; at Royal Music in Royal Oak; Hammell Music, both Livonia and Birmingham stores; or Madonna College.

The competition was the first of its kind sponsored by Oakway Symphony, and is expected to be an annual spring-time event.
